For a comprehensive understanding, it is not only important to get to know the minorities' institutional structures. It is also vital to meet personally with the minorities' members.

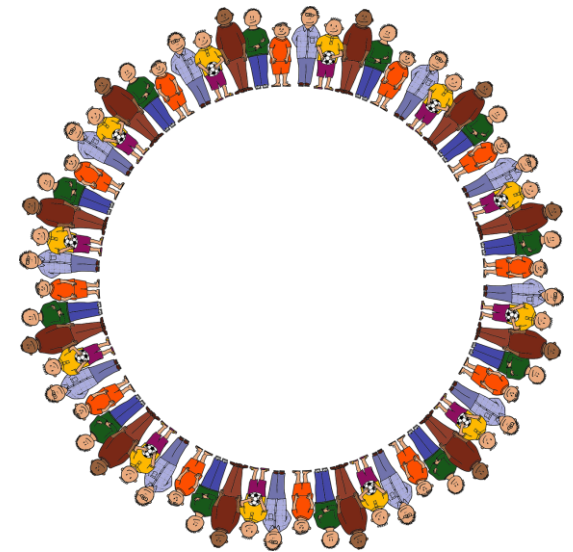
Connected across borders
